

SECTION 4. Chir 10.015 is created to read:

Chir 10.015 Chiropractic technician course of study. A person applying for certification as a chiropractic technician shall successfully complete a course of study including a prerequisite 4.5 hour therapeutic overview course covering chiropractic technician scope of practice, anatomy, and contraindications followed by all of the following:

- (1) 36 hours in exercise/rehabilitation including all of the following topics:
 - (a) Basic functional anatomy
 - (b) Kinematics
 - (c) Joint movement
 - (d) Microbiology
 - (e) Indications and contraindications
 - (f) Recordkeeping/reporting
 - (g) Report writing
 - (h) Scope of practice
 - (i) Outcome tools
 - (j) Baselines assessment and goals
- (2) 4 hours in patient history
- (3) 4 hours in physical examination (height, weight, and blood pressure)
- (4) 1 hour in thermotherapy/cryotherapy
- (5) 2 hours in mechanical therapy with necessary equipment available
- (6) 3 hours in electrotherapy
- (7) 3 hours in therapeutic ultrasound therapy
- (8) 3 hours in light therapy
- (9) 3 hours in surface electromyography
- (10) 4 hours in decompression/traction with necessary equipment available

Chir 10.025 Chiropractic radiological technician course of study. A person applying for certification as a chiropractic radiological technician shall successfully complete a course of study consisting of 48 hours including all of the following topics:

- (a) Introduction to x-ray examination
- (b) Physics of x-ray examination
- (c) Anatomy

- (d) Patient position
- (e) Safety measures
- (d) Machine operation
- (e) Exposure techniques and accessories
- (f) Processing and dark room techniques
- (g) Film critique and quality assurance
- (h) Professionalism
- (i) Recordkeeping
- (k) Emergency procedures summary
