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

PETITION FOR SUMMARY SUSPENSION
[Wis. Stat. § 441.07 and Wis. Admin. Code ch. SPS 6]

I, Kim M. Kluck, being duly on affirmation, upon information and belief, depose and state as follows:

1. I am an attorney employed by the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department), Division of Legal Services and Compliance (Division). In the course of my professional duties I have been assigned to investigate case number 15 NUR 276 on behalf of the Wisconsin Board of Nursing (Board). The case concerns the professional nursing license of Nicole A. Hunt, Respondent.

2. My business address is 1400 East Washington Avenue, Madison, Wisconsin, and my business mailing address is P.O. Box 7190, Madison, WI 53707-7190.

3. Respondent Nicole A. Hunt, R.N., (dob May 8, 1982), is licensed in the State of Wisconsin as professional nurse, having license number 147603-30, first issued on June 17, 2004 and current through February 29, 2016. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Department is 435 ½ East Main Street, Plymouth, Wisconsin 53073.

4. Sarah Lynn Hetchler (Hetchler) has a tracheostomy and ventilator dependent child who was one of Respondent's pediatric patients in February 2015. Respondent provided home nursing care for the pediatric patient at Hetchler's residence in Little Chute, Wisconsin.

5. On February 7, 2015, Respondent presented to the Hetchler residence to provide nursing cares for the pediatric patient while Hetchler and her husband went to an appointment outside the home. A second professional nurse was in their home at the time providing home nursing care for the other Hetchler child on that date.

6. When Hetchler and her husband returned home, Respondent was trying to hide her eyes from Hetchler and was talking slow. The other professional nurse informed Hetchler that during the time that Hetchler and her husband were absent from our home, Respondent smoked marijuana on the front porch and then returned to provide care for Hetchler's child.

7. Elizabeth Beyer, R.N., is a professional nurse, employed as a private duty nurse to provide home nursing care for a pediatric patient at the Hetchler residence in Little Chute, Wisconsin.

8. On February 7, 2015, Ms. Beyer was at the Hetchler residence providing home nursing care for one of the children at which time Respondent Nicole A. Hunt was also at the residence providing care for the other child.

9. On that date, Respondent told Ms. Beyer she was going to go outside to smoke a cigarette. When Respondent came back in a short time later, her eyes were all squinty and bloodshot. Respondent then placed her bag on the table and when she moved the bag, Beyer noticed a "skunky" odor from the bag. Respondent then proceeded to provide nursing care for the child until the Hetchler parents returned approximately an hour later.

10. Mindy Pena Armenta (Armenta's) has a ventilator dependent child who was one of Respondent's pediatric patients in July 2014. Respondent provided home nursing care for Armenta's child at Armenta's home in Fond Du Lac, Wisconsin.

11. On July 11, 2014, Respondent was in Armenta's home working with her ventilator dependent four year old daughter. Armenta had to leave the home for a doctor's appointment and left her daughter alone with Respondent for 1 ½ hours, returning home around 3:30 p.m. When Armenta returned, she found Respondent passed out on her couch, with her bra hanging over the chair and paperwork spread about. Armenta was unable to wake Respondent and found her daughter sleeping in her room, not hooked up to her pulse oximeter. Armenta made several attempts to wake Respondent, but was unsuccessful.

12. During this time, Armenta had to suction her daughter. Even the noise from the suctioning did not wake Respondent up. At approximately 6:30 p.m., Respondent finally woke up.

13. On May 21, 2015, Investigator Tiffany Brussow (Brussow), in the course of her duties as an investigator, contacted Respondent at the email address on file with the Department. In the email, she informed Respondent that she was an investigator with the Department and had been assigned on behalf of the Wisconsin Board of Nursing (Board) to investigate a complaint made against her by Sarah Hetchler. Brussow asked that she provide a couple dates and times in the first two weeks in June that she could meet with Brussow at the Department for an interview.

14. As of the date of this Petition for Summary Suspension, Respondent has not replied to Brussow's email.

15. On May 22, 2015, Brussow attempted to contact Respondent at the phone number on file with the Department. Respondent did not answer the phone. The voicemail recording identified the number as belonging to "Nicole". Brussow left a voicemail for Respondent indicating that she was an investigator with the Department and had been assigned on behalf of the Board to investigate a complaint made against her. Brussow indicated that she had sent an email the previous day and needed to hear back from her regarding dates and times that she could present herself to the Department for an interview. Brussow informed Respondent that she

would be out of the office the following week, but expected her to leave a voicemail or email with proposed dates by the time Brussow returned to the office on June 1, 2015.

16. As of the date of this Petition for Summary Suspension, Respondent has not returned this phone call.

17. On June 4, 2015, Brussow sent a subpoena via certified mail to Respondent's address on file with the Department. This subpoena was signed by Prosecuting Attorney, Kim Kluck, and required Respondent's appearance at the Department on June 15, 2015, at 10:30 a.m.

18. Respondent did not show up on June 15, 2015 at the Department.

19. On June 17, 2015, Brussow attempted to contact Respondent at the phone number on file with the Department. Respondent did not pick up the phone. The voicemail recording identified the number as belonging to "Nicole". Brussow left a voicemail for Respondent indicating that she had attempted to reach her by phone, email and sent a subpoena to her address on file. Brussow informed her that she failed to show up to the Department for the subpoenaed interview. Brussow asked that she call her back and propose dates and times that she could present herself to the Department for an interview.

20. As of the date of this Petition for Summary Suspension, Respondent has not returned this call.

21. On June 25, 2015, Brussow received a certified copy of a criminal complaint and judgment of conviction from the Sheboygan County clerk of court in case number 2014CM941. According to the sworn complaint of Sgt. Eugene Wielgosh, a Sheboygan County Sheriff's Department deputy made contact with Respondent on State Highway 32 on October 9, 2014. The deputy subsequently conducted a search of Respondent's vehicle which revealed a glass pipe which had the odor of burnt marijuana and a bottle of medication which did not belong to Respondent. Respondent pled guilty to and was convicted of one (1) count of possession of drug paraphernalia on January 29, 2015.

WHEREFORE, the Division hereby requests that the Board:

1. Find that sufficient notice of this proceeding has been given to Respondent Nicole A. Hunt, R.N., as required by Wis. Admin. Code ch. SPS 6.05.

2. Find that Wis. Stat. §§ 227.51(3), 441.07, and Wis. Admin. Code ch. SPS 6.06(1), provide the Board with authority to summarily suspend Respondent's nursing license upon probable cause to believe that Respondent violated the provisions of chapter 441, Wisconsin Statutes, and probable cause to believe that the public health, safety, or welfare imperatively requires emergency action.

3. Find probable cause to believe that Respondent has violated Wis. Stat. § 441.07 and Wis. Admin. Code § N 7.03(6)(e) by practicing nursing while under the influence of alcohol, illicit drugs, or while impaired by the use of legitimately prescribed pharmacological agents or medications.

4. Find probable cause to believe that Respondent has violated Wis. Admin. Code § N 7.03(1)(c) by, after a request of the board, failing to cooperate in a timely manner, with the board's investigation of a complaint filed against a license holder.

5. Find probable cause to believe that Respondent has violated Wis. Admin. Code § N 7.03(8)(e) by obtaining, possessing or attempting to obtain or possess a drug without lawful authority.

6. Find probable cause to believe that Respondent has violated Wis. Admin. Code § N 7.03(1)¹ by being negligent which is a substantial departure from the standard of care ordinarily exercised by a competent licensee.

7. Find probable cause to believe that Respondent Wis. Admin. Code § N 7.03(1)(b)² by an act or omission demonstrating a failure to maintain competency in practice and methods of nursing care.

8. Find it is necessary to immediately suspend Respondent's license to practice as a professional nurse in the State of Wisconsin, including the multi-state privilege to practice under the Nurse Licensure Compact to protect the public's health, safety or welfare.


9. Issue an order summarily suspending Respondent's right to renew her license to practice as a professional nurse in the State of Wisconsin, and to also summarily suspend Respondent's multi-state privilege to practice under the Nurse Licensure Compact.

10. Notify Respondent that she has the right to request a hearing to show cause as to why the summary suspension order should not be continued.

11. Provide the identification of witnesses providing evidence at the time the petition for summary suspension was presented and identification of the evidence used as a basis for the decision to issue the summary suspension order.

12. Order that such suspension shall continue until the effective date of a final decision and order issued in the above-captioned disciplinary proceeding, unless otherwise ordered by the Board, and for such other relief as the Board deems appropriate.

Sgt. Eugene Wielgosh, Sheboygan County Sheriff's Department, being first duly sworn on oath deposes and says on information and belief:

Count 1: POSSESSION OF DRUG PARAPHERNALIA

The above-named defendant on Thursday, October 09, 2014, in the Town of Sheboygan Falls, Sheboygan County, Wisconsin, did knowingly possess drug paraphernalia with the primary intent to use, inject, ingest, inhale or otherwise introduce into the human body a controlled substance or a controlled substance analog in violation of law, contrary to sec. 961.573(1) Wis. Stats.

Upon conviction for this offense, a Misdemeanor, the defendant may be fined not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500), or imprisoned for not more than thirty (30) days, or both.

And the Court may suspend the defendant's operating privileges for not less than six (6) months nor more than five (5) years. If the defendant's driving privileges are already suspended, any suspension imposed must be served consecutively.

Count 2: POSSESS/ILLEGALLY OBTAINED PRESCRIPTION

Dismiss

The above-named defendant on Thursday, October 09, 2014, in the Town of Sheboygan Falls, Sheboygan County, Wisconsin, did possess an illegally obtained prescription drug, contrary to sec. 450.11(7)(h), 450.11(9)(a) Wis. Stats.

Upon conviction for this offense, a Misdemeanor, the defendant may be fined not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) or imprisoned not more than six (6) months or both.

The basis of complainant's charge of such offense is: Official reports prepared by Deputy Shawn Tennessen and Deputy Justin Krogstad both of the Sheboygan County Sheriff's Department, which reports indicate that on October 9, 2014, while patrolling in the area of County Highway J and State Highway 57 Deputy Tennessen was advised by dispatch that a call was received regarding a vehicle traveling westbound on State Highway 23 from State Highway 32 that was all over the roadway. The vehicle was described as a green Pontiac Bonneville bearing Wisconsin registration 119-VXY and was now stopped in the turn lane on State Highway 32 turning southbound onto Pleasant View Road.

Deputy Tennessen proceeded to that location and when he arrived at the intersection he saw a green Pontiac Bonneville stopped in the turning lane and approximately 5-7 cars stopped behind it.

Dispatch further advised the vehicle was listed to a Nicole A. Hunt, d.o.b. 05-08-82, herein after referred to as the defendant, and that the defendant had an extensive illegal drug history.

Deputy Tennessen pulled up behind the vehicle and exited his squad. He then made contact with the driver, the defendant, and asked why she had stopped in traffic. She said her vehicle had stalled due to what she believed to be fuel injector problems. In speaking with the defendant Deputy Tennessen noted that her speech was very slow and slurred and she had difficulty talking. She also looked very tired.


Deputy Tennessen then asked the defendant to exit the vehicle in order to perform a series of field sobriety tests. The defendant's performance on these tests indicated to Deputy Tennessen, based upon his training and experience, that the defendant was under the influence of some type of drug to the point where she could not safely operate a motor vehicle.

Deputy Krogstad arrived on scene to assist. Both officers then conducted a search of the defendant's motor vehicle incident to arrest.


Deputy Krogstad reports that in the front seat he uncovered an unmarked prescription bottle containing a 3" glass pipe, which he recognized based on his training and experience in the identification of illegal controlled substances and the paraphernalia associated with them, to be used for smoking marijuana. The pipe had the odor of burnt marijuana about it. Also in the front seat was a cloth purse and inside the purse Deputy

Krogstad discovered a prescription medication bottle containing three white spherical pills with a capital "E" on them. This prescription bottle was from Walgreen's and under the name of Mary Singleton and had a medication name of Benzonatate 100 mg. on it. This identification was confirmed via Drugs.com. Deputy Krogstad indicates that he has been trained in drug identification. This drug is not a controlled drug but is considered an antitussive used for coughing during pregnancy.



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


