Page 5: 330.01 (12) Add EMS to definition of firefighter?

Page 6: 330.01(22m) Title should be changed to Health and Safety Officer and this term used throughout document (Paul Nelson)

Page 6: 330.01(16m) Incident Safety Officer: A member of the command staff responsible for monitoring and assessing safety hazards or unsafe situations and for developing measures for ensuring personnel safety. Recommended trainings include the National Fire Academy's Incident Safety Officer, or the Fire Department Safety Officers Association Certified Incident Safety Officer courses. (New language per Silva) (I would require this by Jan 1, 2020)

Page 6: 330.01(22) A qualified instructor can be anyone who is knowledgeable in the topic and has received training in adult educational methodology, and not necessarily an instructor from the Wisconsin technical college system. (New language per Silva) (Should this be grandfathered till 2020?)

Page 6: 330.01(22m): Health and Safety Officer: An individual assigned and authorized by the fire chief as a manager of a health and safety program designed to assess: Risk Management, Accident Prevention, Laws, Codes, and Standards and Health Maintenance. Recommended trainings include the National Fire Academy's Health and Safety Officer, or the Fire Department Safety Officers Association Certified Health and Safety Officer courses. (New language per Silva)

Page 20: 330.07(2)(b) The training shall be provided by a qualified instructor.

Page 23: 330.08(2)(b): New pumper operators and new aerial operators shall be provided the training specified in this subsection within 12 months. After January 1, 2020 new firefighters will not act as pumper operators or aerial operators before receiving the specified training.

Page 24: 330.08(3): A new fire officer, after appointment, shall be provided basic officer training within 12 months of appointment. After January 1, 2020 new fire officers will not supervise at emergency scenes before receiving the required basic officer training.

Page 40-41: 330.13(2) Life Safety Ropes, Harnesses, and Hardware. Every fire department shall follow NFPA 1983 (Charlie Meyers)

Page 40-41: Eliminate 330.13(2) (a) (b) (c) (d) (e) (f) (Charlie Meyers)
