

Dear Cross Connection Control Assembly Tester:

Effective January 1, 2010 there is a significant change in the process for cross connection control assembly registration and test reporting.

First, to facilitate getting all cross connection control assemblies registered with the department, the **registration fee** has been **reduced from \$200 to \$20 if registered on line** and paid by credit card or AHC (automatic clearing house like the check routing mechanism used for tax refunds). The fee will be **\$30 if registered by paper** by submitting the general plumbing registration form (SBD 6154).

Secondly, a code change effective January 1 sets a **fee for each test result on each cross connection control assembly** required to be reported to the department. That fee is also **\$20 if reported on line** and paid by credit card or AHC or **\$30 if reported by paper** using the CCC Performance test form (SBD 9927). This fee will be required for any test report received after January 1, 2010. We will honor postmarks up to that date to take into account any holiday mailing delays.

The Safety & Buildings web application will be functional the first week in January and can be accessed from the following link:

As with any new application, we expect some bugs during the first couple of weeks. In the event that the **web application is indicated as "not available"** any time during January 2010, you may print that "not available" message and send that printed page with your test results or registration with the \$20 electronic submittal fee even though you are submitting by paper. Send to the mailing address on our forms.
