**Reason for Credential:** Except as provided under s. 145.06 (4) Stats., and pursuant to s. 145.06, Stats., no person may install plumbing unless the person holds a credential issued by the department as a licensed master plumber, licensed master plumber-restricted, licensed journeyman plumber, licensed journeyman plumber-restricted, registered plumbing apprentice, registered plumbing learner-restricted, registered utility contractor or registered pipe layer.

**Requirements of Credential:** Pursuant to s. 145.14, Stats., the plumbing activities that may be undertaken by a person who holds a credential as a licensed master plumber-restricted service, licensed journeyman plumber-restricted service or a registered plumbing learner-restricted service shall be limited to the installation or modification of all of the following:

- Privately owned wastewater treatment systems and components under SPS 383.
- Building sewers and private interceptor main sewers under SPS 382.
- Water services and private water mains under SPS 382.

A person who holds the credential shall carry on his or her person the credential issued by the department while performing or conducting the activity or activities permitted under the credential.

A person who, as a licensed master plumber-restricted service, is responsible for an installation or modification of plumbing shall utilize the appropriate credentialed persons to install or modify plumbing. A business engaged in the installation of plumbing that utilizes plumbing learners shall maintain a ratio of at least one journeyman plumber or journeyman plumber-restricted for each

plumbing learner. For this purpose, a master plumber or master plumber-restricted may act as a journeyman plumber or journeyman plumber-restricted, respectively.

For any construction or installation that requires a uniform building permit under SPS 320.08, persons, entities, or businesses which hold licenses, certifications, or registrations as identified in SPS 305 may not commence work until a permit is issued.

**Education Hours Required to Renew:** The renewal of a license as a master plumber-restricted service shall be contingent upon the master plumber-restricted service obtaining at least 12 hours of acceptable continuing education three months prior to the expiration date of their credential. A person who holds a license as a master plumber-restricted service may apply to the department for waiver of the continuing education requirements on the grounds of prolonged illness or disability or similar circumstances. Each application for waiver shall be considered individually on its merits by the department.

## Applying for Master Plumber - Restricted Service License

A person may obtain a credential as a licensed master plumber-restricted service by one of the following methods:

- Method 1      Completing the necessary hours of experience and taking and passing the master plumber-restricted service license examination.
- Method 2      Submitting evidence that the person possesses a master plumber-restricted service license-retiree.
- Method 3      A person who held a master plumber-restricted service license but exchanged it for a journeyman plumber-restricted service license may, upon application to the department, exchange his or her journeyman plumber-restricted service license, for a master plumber-restricted service license. If the exchange is made at the time of renewal a credential fee of \$500 for the master plumber-restricted service license shall be submitted.

**Special Processing Note:** If you hold a current license from another state, or under the ordinances of any city, town or village, you must first complete a petition for variance in accord with SPS 305.90(4)(c) and (d). Upon successful completion of the variance process, complete the examination application as specified in Method 1 and provide a copy of the petition approval correspondence.

### Method 1 - Experience and Examination

**Application and Exam Fee (nonrefundable): \$50.00**      class code 7630

Make checks payable to: State of WI - DSPS. The fee consists of a \$20 application fee and an exam fee of \$30. When the exam is passed, the applicant will be asked to pay a \$500 credential fee, prorated because the credential expires on a specific date. The credential, which will be issued after the exam is passed and the prorated credential fee paid, is effective for four years from March 31.

**Qualifications for Examination:** A person applying for a master plumber-restricted service license examination shall have at least 1,000 hours of experience per year for at least two consecutive years as a Wisconsin licensed journeyman plumber-restricted service.

If the experience you gained spanned more than 12 consecutive months use a separate row for each 12-month period. The Time Period must be consecutive years from one row to the next. In the Time Period column fill in the beginning month and year and the ending month and year in which the experience hours were completed. In the Experience Hours column fill in the number of hours claimed for that time period but do not record more than 1000 hours in the column even if you worked more than 1000 hours. If the hours were witnessed by more than one person, the hours witnessed by each person must be filled in on separate rows. Photocopies of this page may be made if you need additional room or would like to mail to witnesses to sign. The witness must have observed or had knowledge of the number for work hours performed in plumbing. If the person signing is not the master plumber or master plumber-restricted service who supervised your work, attach an explanation and have the master who is in charge on the premises sign below.

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In order to obtain the credential the applicant must obtain a score of at least 70% on an examination. The exam will cover Chapter 145, Wisconsin Statutes; and cSPS 305 and SPS 382-387, Wisconsin Administrative Code; NFPA 13D-2002. The exam is open code book, component manuals, NFPA, and statutes. When there is a change to Wisconsin Administrative Codes, exams will cover the new code one month after the effective date.

Copies of current Wisconsin Administrative Codes and Chapter 145 may be obtained from Document Sales, 608-266-3358 or 800-362-7253. The NFPA standards 13 (2002 edition) may be ordered from the National Fire Protection Association, 800-344-3555.

You will need a knowledge of the component manuals for the various POWTS. You may bring these to the exam site.
