SUBJECT: 2009 Wisconsin Act 392 Information

During the last few days of the recently completed legislative session two bills [AB 950 and SB 687] were introduced and acted on. The result is 2009 Wisconsin Act 392. This legislation amends certain portions of chapter 145, Wis. Stats., by adding language that addresses dates for completing the POWTS Inventory and administering a POWTS maintenance program. A copy of the Act is included with this memo.

A brief summary of 2009 Wisconsin Act 392 is as follows:

- The three year time frame to complete the inventory as listed in s. Comm 83.255(1)(a), Wis. Adm. Code, has been superseded by a statutory deadline of Oct. 01, 2013.
- The five year time frame to develop and implement a maintenance program as listed in s. Comm 83.255(2)(a), Wis. Adm. Code, has been superseded by a statutory deadline of Oct. 01, 2015.
- Completion of an inventory and development of a maintenance program is now a statutory requirement.
- WI Fund grant eligibility is contingent on the deadlines, as listed in the applicable statute section, being met.

We will be preparing a Scope Statement in the near future that will allow us to begin work on a revision package for chapter Comm 83, Wis. Adm. Code, to address changes that will be necessary as a result of 2009 Wisconsin Act 392.

You may be interested in the status of the POWTS Inventory. Enclosed is a document that includes pertinent information from surveys that were conducted during 2006, 2008 and earlier this year. It is interesting to note that the statewide POWTS Inventory is about 75% complete based on information that was provided during the surveys.
