

Two pieces of legislation would affect construction industry in Wisconsin

Possible \$\$\$ penalty from S&B for plumbing without a license

Assembly bill 750 would allow the Department of Commerce, Safety and Buildings Division, to directly assess a forfeiture for persons found violating rules about plumbing without a license. Currently, S&B staff can issue an order and the forfeitures are assessed by courts. Bill 750 was being considered by the state legislature in early February as this WCCR was prepared.

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Contractors may need education, face testing

Residential contractors now can't pull a building permit unless they are certified by the state Department of Commerce Safety and Buildings Division. In the future contractors may need to pass an exam to be certified, and may have to fulfill continuing education requirements.

Under state Senate bill 516, which had passed through one legislative committee and was headed for another in early February as this WCCR was being prepared, anyone wanting to pull a permit as a residential contractor would need to complete 12 hours of continuing education, attend one professional meeting per year, provide proof of financial responsibility and adherence to worker's compensation rules, and possibly pass a proficiency test.


The test requirements vary as to whether or not a person is now in business or begins a new business.

Now, according to the law and Comm 5, the Licensing, Registration, and Certification Code, someone wanting to pull a permit needs to be certified by S&B as following financial responsibility and worker's compensation requirements (Dwelling Contractor Financial Responsibility Certification, Comm 5.31).

Current law provides that, with certain exceptions, a contractor may not begin construction on a building that is subject to the Uniform Dwelling Code

Possible change in plumbing without a license enforcement

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Current law states that no person may engage in or work at plumbing unless licensed to do so by the Department of Commerce. Current law also provides several exceptions to this prohibition. For example, the prohibition does not apply to plumbing work done by a property owner in a one-family building owned and occupied as a home or farm building, except where a license is required by local ordinance. In addition, the prohibition does not apply to making minor repairs to faucets, valves, pipes, or appliances, repair or replacement of electrical or gas energy or other automatic valves or control devices, or removing stoppages in waste or drainage pipes. Current law provides that through the state court system any person cited by S&B staff for violating the prohibition on engaging in plumbing without a license is subject to imprisonment for not more than three months, or a fine of not more than \$500.

Assembly Substitute Amendment 1 states that in lieu of any other penalty, the Department of Commerce may directly assess a forfeiture by issuing an order against any person who violates the prohibition on practice of plumbing without a license described above. The department could not assess a forfeiture exceeding \$2,000 for each violation. The substitute amendment requires the

Department of Commerce to promulgate rules specifying the procedures governing the assessment of forfeitures including the following: (1) the procedure for issuing an order for an alleged violation; (2) the amount of a forfeiture that the department may assess for an alleged violation, subject to the statutory limitation; (3) the procedure for contesting an order issued for an alleged violation; and (4) the procedure for contesting the assessment of a forfeiture for an alleged violation.

The substitute amendment requires the department to remit all forfeitures to the Secretary of Administration for deposit in the School Fund. All forfeitures that are not paid as required accrue interest at the rate of 12 percent per year. In addition, the substitute amendment states that the Attorney General may bring an action in the name of the state to collect any forfeiture imposed, or interest accrued, if the forfeiture or interest has not been paid after the exhaustion of all administrative and judicial reviews.

The substitute amendment differs from the original bill in that the substitute amendment only covered violation of the prohibition on engaging in plumbing without a license, while the original bill covers engaging in a variety of professions or activities without a license, permit, or certificate of certification or registration issued by the Department of Commerce.



Legislature considering strengthening contractor certifications

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unless they obtain a building permit from the municipality administering the code. Where no municipality is authorized to administer the code, S&B has organized the enforcement system. Current law also provides that a person may not obtain a building permit unless the person annually obtains from S&B a certificate of financial responsibility showing that the person has met bonding and insurance requirements.

There is an exception to allow the owner of a property to pull the permit without having the dwelling contractor certification and, in that case, to allow the work to be done without the contractor being certified.

The exception is continued in Senate bill 516.

Bill 516 establishes that a person could not obtain a UDC building permit unless the person completes certain continuing education requirements and furnishes to the issuer of the permit proof of completion of those requirements (At least 12 hours of approved continuing education courses during the two calendar years before the person applies for the permit). The person must also have attended at least one professional meeting or education seminar during that two-year period.

If the person has not previously held a certificate of financial responsibility, the person must also pass an examination, which would be developed by S&B.

The bill allows S&B to specify different continuing education requirements that apply to experienced and inexperienced permit applicants.

The bill also authorizes S&B to revoke or suspend a certificate of financial responsibility if

the holder fails to comply with continuing education requirements, engages in the construction of a dwelling without a permit, is convicted of a crime related to the construction of a dwelling, or has been adjudged bankrupt on two or more occasions.

Under current law, the Contractor Financial Responsibility Council recommends for promulgation by S&B rules for certifying the financial responsibility of contractors. This bill renames that council as the Contractor Certification Council and gives the council additional responsibilities. Under the bill, the

council would recommend courses that meet continuing education requirements for persons applying for a building permit under the UDC and advise on development of examinations.

Under current law, municipalities must provide an owner who applies for a building permit with a statement advising that if the owner hires a contractor who is not bonded or insured under current law, certain consequences might occur. Under bill 516, the municipality must require the owner to sign such a statement.

This bill requires rules that specify S&B may suspend or revoke the certification of an inspector who knowingly authorizes the issuance of a building permit to a contractor who does not comply with financial responsibility or continuing education requirements.

Commercial and UDC construction site erosion control, stormwater practices would change

Proposed revision of the commercial and one- and two-family dwelling building codes could change the way erosion control and stormwater management are implemented in Wisconsin. Although many of the requirements are identical to what exist without the revisions, the inspection and enforcement for construction site erosion control and post construction stormwater management would be more emphasized for commercial and UDC inspectors licensed by the Safety and Buildings Division.

A public hearing was held January 18, 2006, on code revisions to Comm 20-25, Uniform Dwelling Code, and Comm 61-65, Commercial Building Code (announced in the WCCR and to S&B email groups.)
