The end-of-the-year classes will be in Green Bay, Eau Claire, and Waukesha. (Specific dates and locations were not set by this publication's deadline.)

There also will be classes in January - March, 2004 in those same cities and in Fond du Lac, Hayward, Mineral Point, Wausau, West Bend, and Wisconsin Dells.

In December, a.m. and p.m. sessions (three credit hours per session) will be given on two tracks: "Plumbing Code Update" and "POWTS Trade Session." A person will be able to earn six credit hours over the full day.

S&B will provide chairs for the con ed students to use.



Each session will cost \$40 and will include refreshments, but not lunch.

The a.m. session will be 8:30 - 11:30. The p.m. meetings will be 12:30 - 3:30. Attendees will need to arrive 30 minutes early to check in.



Refrigeration code changes expected to be effective Nov. 1

On November 1, 2003, changes to Comm 45, Mechanical Refrigeration administrative code, are expected to go into effect, notably with the adoption of the International Mechanical Code (IMC-2000), ASHRAE 15-1994, and IAR-2 1999 International Standards.

The new Comm 45 contains basically the same administration and enforcement provisions as the current version.

The exact date of the changes going into effect depends upon official printing by the state's Revisor of Statutes.

Electrical Q&A

Based on the 2002 National Electrical Code. For info, contact one of the S&B Consultants listed below.

Question: I see the local telecommunication company using some kind of orange raceway. Can these raceways be used for general wiring?



Answer: These raceways are not listed for use in general wiring. NEC 110.3(b) requires following the instructions included with listing and labeling for use. Those raceways are listed for fibre-optic cable only.

Question: I'm installing some isolated ground receptacles for use with computers in an accounting office. The specifications require running the isolated grounding conductor back to the service. Is this necessary? Does the code require it?

Answer: It is necessary if the specifications require it. Article 250.146(D) allows the use of an isolated ground receptacle. It allows the grounding conductor to pass through one or more panel boards, without connection to the panelboard grounding terminal, so as to terminate in the same building or structure directly at an equipment grounding conductor terminal of the applicable derived system or service. The NEC does not require it to go all the way to the service. However, routing the conductor to the service can ensure as clean a ground as possible. The isolated ground is used to alleviate "electronic noise" from the grounding circuit conductor of the equipment.

Question: If a motor control center is used as service equipment, is it required to be marked "Suitable for Use as Service Equipment?"

Answer: Yes, Section 430.95 requires a single main disconnect when a MCC is used as service equipment and Section 230.66 states that service equipment rated at 600 volts or less shall be marked to identify it as suitable for use as service equipment.

Backflow protection doesn't magically change water to nonpotable

Recent inquiries to the division raised questions about proper labeling of piping downstream of cross connection control devices or assemblies, such as the reduced pressure principle backflow preventers, RPs.

If you're confused you're not alone. There's a misconception that whenever an RP valve is installed, the downstream piping should be labeled as "nonpotable." That's not correct. Installing an RP doesn't change the quality of the water in the piping system.



2. To prevent backflow from a piping system. This is known as "containment". The code requires containment for nonpotable piping systems, wastewater treatment plant potable and process piping systems, and marina potable piping systems. The code language states that containment in a building or structure does not alleviate the need for isolation. See Comm 82.41(3)(c)3.

There are two reasons to install an RP (or other type of cross connection control):

1. To prevent backflow at an individual fixture, appliance, or piece of equipment. This is known as "isolation". The Wisconsin Uniform Plumbing Code requires isolation of all connections to a water supply system.

There are several scenarios where the RP is installed:

- For example, an RP is serving plumbing fixtures in a wastewater treatment plant. The water downstream of the RP must remain potable

and could be labeled as “potable water” or “plumbing fixtures water.” It would be inappropriate to label the piping as nonpotable in this situation, even though an RP is installed.



- Or, an RP is serving a process nonpotable water system. Here’s the classic situation where the piping system must be labeled “nonpotable.”

Or, an RP is installed to serve a piping system where the pipe is not a code compliant material. The water quality is considered to be compromised and the label of “nonpotable” is appropriate.

- Or, an RP is serving a boiler. The water supplying the boiler isn’t nonpotable, but there’s increased risk that the water carried in the piping system downstream of the valve may become nonpotable. The piping serving a boiler could be labeled “boiler water.”

Or, an RP separates two nonpotable systems, where one system is considered a low hazard and the other is classified as high hazard. In this case, both systems could be labeled “nonpotable.” However, it would be more appropriate to label the systems as to their intended use. For example, one could be labeled “toilet flushing – 82.70-1 #9,” and the other could be labeled as “subsurface irrigation – 82.70-1 #7.”

Wastewater and stormwater use systems – What’s needed according to the plumbing code?

With creation of Comm 82.70 and changes to 82.34, effective last May 1, there are questions concerning the review and maintenance tracking of these wastewater and stormwater use systems.

Some quick answers are available here. A flow-chart, more thoroughly describing the situation, is available on the S&B WebSite, <http://www.commerce.state.wi.us/SB/SB-LibraryIndex.html>. Paper copies of the diagram may be obtained from Todd Taylor, 608-267-3606.

A wastewater reuse or stormwater use system requires plan review for every installation.

A reuse system that recycles blackwater requires an alternate or experimental reuse system approval.

A wastewater treatment manufactured product requires review by S&B: contact Product Reviewer Glen Schlueter, 608-267-1401, gschlueter@commerce.state.wi.us. If a single “device” has product review, the footnote to Table 82.20-1 allows it to be installed without plan review.

This would be a single product that requires no piping between units. “Plug and Play” goes without plan review.

The product review for such products *could* require “registration” whenever the product is installed. The product approval can not stipulate a complete plan review for a single device.

A wastewater reuse and stormwater use system requires plan review whenever it is installed.

Table 82.38-1 covers pool wastewater discharge

Water may be discharged from swimming pool equipment or basins as permitted in Comm Table 82.38-1. This table specifies drain wastewater or backwash from sand filters from public swimming pools or wading pools must be discharged to one of the following points:

- A private onsite wastewater treatment system that’s designed to accept the volume and flow from the pool.
- A municipal sanitary sewer or combined sanitary-storm sewer (unless prohibited by the local municipality).
- A municipal storm sewer or ground surface (unless prohibited by the local municipality). A discharge permit may be required by the DNR for this type of discharge.
- A subsurface infiltration/dispersal system that has been approved by a Safety and Buildings Division plan reviewer.

Another portion of the Table 82.38-1 contains

requirements for diatomaceous earth filter backwash. This filter backwash may only be discharged to the sanitary system, including the sanitary municipal sewer, combination sewer or a POWTS.

Whirlpool discharge from backwash or drain may not be discharged to subsurface, but may be discharged to the storm system if not prohibited by the local municipality. The DNR may require a DNR 216 permit.

It’s desirable to discharge whirlpool backwash or drainage water to the sanitary system, if available.
