RE: WB-36 Buyer Agency and Tenant Representation

The DSPS Real Estate Contractual Forms Advisory Council met on November 17 to review the issues regarding the tenant representation provisions in the WB-36 Buyer Agency/Tenant Representation Agreement. The DSPS Forms Council did not reach a consensus and had no recommendation for the Real Estate Examining Board.

They wanted to know the following from the REEB:

- 1. Do they just want the tenant provisions removed from the WB-36?
- 2. Do they want the tenant provisions removed from the WB-36 and put into a separate tenant representation agreement, so we end up with two separate agreements?
- 3. Do they just want the WB-36 revised, clarified, and simplified so it is clearer at the beginning of the form, for example, put check boxes instead of the STRIKE ONE feature, make the tenant provisions shorter, more concise since some of the language in the tenant provisions is the same or similar to language in the purchase section?

The REEB met on December 8 and we were told they had directed the DSPS Forms Council to break the WB-36 into two forms - revise the WB-36 to make it buyer representation only and create a new WB tenant representation form. They indicated the WB-38 Commercial Buyer Agency/Tenant Representation Agreement should not be changed.

Attached please find preliminary drafts of a revised WB-36 with the tenant representation provisions removed (hopefully) and a new tenant representation agreement based on the provisions for tenant representation from the WB-36. Spacing and formatting will need to be finalized once the content is satisfactory.

The REEB did not ask for any modifications to the buyer agency and the tenant representation agreements or provisions other than the division into two forms.

Wis. Stat. § 240.10 Real estate agency contracts.

- (1) Every contract to pay a commission to a real estate agent or broker or to any other person for selling or buying real estate shall be void unless such contract or note or memorandum thereof describes that real estate; expresses the price for which the same may be sold or purchased, the commission to be paid and the period during which the agent or broker shall procure a buyer or seller; is in writing; and is subscribed by the person agreeing to pay such commission, except that a contract to pay a commission to a person for locating a type of property need not describe the property.
- (2) Every contract to pay a commission to any real estate agent or broker or to any person for leasing real estate for a term exceeding 3 years shall be void unless such contract, note or memorandum thereof describes that real estate; expresses the rent to be paid or a method to determine the same, the length of

the lease, the commission to be paid, and the period during which said person shall procure a tenant; is in writing; and is subscribed by the person agreeing to pay such commission, except that a contract to pay a commission to a person for locating a type of property need not describe the property.

If you and the firm's other clients in the transaction consent, the firm may provide services through designated agency, which is one type of multiple representation relationship.
- 99 Designated agency means that different agents with the firm will negotiate on behalf of you and the other client or
- 100 clients in the transaction, and the firm's duties to you as a client will remain the same. Each agent will provide 101 information, opinions, and advice to the client for whom the agent is negotiating, to assist the client in the negotiations.

Under this neutral approach, the same agent may represent more than one client in a transaction.
