

National Fire Incident Reporting Systems (NFIRS) Invalid Incidents

An *Invalid Incident* is one that cannot be released to the national database for inclusion in national and state statistics. An incident is invalid because it has not met the NFIRS validation rules (i.e. missing required fields or required modules, incorrect codes, or inconsistent dates/times).


 There are several ways to find invalid incidents. A search can be preformed within either the **Data Entry Tool (DET)** or the **Data** Entry Interface Browser (DEBI), or you may utilize the *Incident Listing report within the* Summary Output Reports Tool (SORT) reports. In each option, after selecting a date range, the Validity field is selected as *Invalid*.

Invalid Reports using DET


1. Open the Data Entry Tool (DET)





2. Login in using your *NFIRS username and password* and clicking *OK* to the Federal System Warning.




3. Select your *FDID* and then clicking on *Open* under Incident.








4. Change the Validity to *Invalid* and selecting the *Date Range* that you looking to review. Click *Search*.




*NOTE.... Remember when working with date ranges, you can select up to the current date but cannot go into the future.


5. The results returned will be all *Invalid Incidents* for the date range specified.




6. To discover the reasons an incident is invalid, *Highlight* the incident, click *Open* and then a new window will open choose *Save*.



The system will automatically display an error message allowing you to choose "YES" to view the errors. The next screen will display the Validation Errors and Warnings. Critical Errors must be fixed for the incident to be valid. Warnings are just to bring a missing data field to your attention that provides better information but does not result in a invalid incident.




*Note.. Please keep in mind that in the State of Wisconsin, Dollar Loss and Narratives are statutorily required fields. Unfortunately, only dollar loss will produce a warning as the Remarks section (narrative) is not currently a required field at the national level.

2. Login to using your *NFIRS username and password* and clicking *OK* to the U.S. Government warning.





2. Invalids can be found by clicking on *Incident*Search from the Menu Bar (green ribbon) above the grayed *Incident Information* box.




3. Next choose your Fire Dept. under the *FDID*, change the Validity to *Invalid*, and select the *date range* that you want to review. The results returned will be all *invalid incidents* for the date range specified. Click on *Search* at the bottom right of the Incident Search window.




*NOTE...Remember when working with date ranges, you can select up to the current date but not go into the future.

4. To discover the reasons an incident is invalid, you will first have to *Open* the incident .



5. DEBI provides an error list, upon clicking on "View the error list" from the left-hand menu following the Red Exclamation Point.



*NOTE...Critical Errors must be fixed for the incidents to be valid. Warnings are just to bring a missing data field to your attention that provides better information but does not result in an invalid incident.

The window which opens will display the Validation Errors and Warning.


Invalid Reports using Summary Output Reports Tool (SORT)

 Vendor Software users: Once the Bulk Import Utility, (BIU) is completed an your incidents have been accepted into the database a list of invalid incidents can be found by running the *Incident Listing* report from the *Summary Output Reports Tool (SORT)* and looking for the *Validity* status of "I".



4. Fill in the **Date parameters**, change **Incident Status** and **Release Status** to **All**. Then use the drop down boxes to find your **Fire Department** and Click on **Generate Report**




5. You will be able to access the report through *My Recent Reports* and/or



an *email* will be sent to let you know when the report is available, generally with in 20 minutes unless it is for a extra large date range and data.



6. Most NFIRS reports are now available in multiple formats: Word, Excel, PDF and html. Just click on which Format you would like to view.

When completing the import process from the NFIRS website, make sure to check both check boxes, Overwrite and Accept Invalids, above the **Browse** area.
