To qualify as a Master’s or Doctoral degree in social work with a concentration in clinical social work, the course of study shall include one course in psychopathology in social work and, two (2) courses from among the following:

- (a) Case management
- (b) Clinical assessment and treatment of specific populations and problems, such as children, adolescent, elderly, alcohol and drug abuse, family or couples relationships.
- (c) Psychopharmacology
- (d) Psychotherapeutic interventions
- (e) Electives such as family therapy, social work with groups, sex- or gender-related issues, and topics.
