SOIL EROSION INSPECTOR CERTIFICATION APPLICATION INFORMATION

Requirements for Credential

Per <u>Wis. Admin. Code § 305.63</u>, no person may conduct the inspection of one- or two-family dwellings for the purpose of administering and enforcing <u>Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 321.125</u>, unless the person holds a certification issued by the Department as a certified Soil Erosion Inspector..

A person who inspects one- or two-family dwellings as a certified Soil Erosion Inspector shall:

- Maintain a record of the inspections made including the dates and the findings of the inspections;
- Provide a copy of the inspection report to the property owner or his or her agent;
- Make available to the Department upon request his or her inspection records.

AN APPLICATION IS NOT COMPLETE UNTIL ALL OF THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS HAVE BEEN RECEIVED:

- 1. <u>Application and Fees</u>: Apply and pay fees online in LicensE, <u>https://license.wi.gov</u>. Fees will be calculated in LicensE. If needed, you can save your application and complete and submit it later. **NOTE:** If DSPS requests additional documents they must be uploaded within three (3) months from the date they were requested. Failure to do so may result in having to submit a new application and fees.
- 2. <u>Training Course</u>: A person applying for a Soil Erosion Inspector certification shall have completed an approved training course on soil erosion control standards.
