



Liquefied Gas Supplier License FAQs

1. Does a person holding a Liquefied Gas Supplier License have to operate its delivery vehicles and storage tanks with the name on the license as recorded with the Department of Safety and Professional Services?

Answer: No, the names used by the company to operate do not have to match the name recorded as holding the license. However, it is helpful to all involved to have some license identification closely available to Commerce staff or other interested parties as to what license the equipment is being operated under. DSPS maintains a list of all licensed LP suppliers. [This list is accessible](#) through the Industry Services Division's Website to aid customers and the department in identifying properly-licensed companies. (Select the "Advanced Search" feature to find the list of Liquefied Gas Suppliers and Suppliers - Restricted.)

2. Does a supplier have to post their license number at their bulk sites?

Answer: No. However, the department recommends posting a sign or placard with the Liquefied Gas Supplier License number at bulk sites to assist in providing identification to inspectors and other parties.
